EGHS Students Recognized as High Achievers in the 2020 National Spanish Exam

Congratulations to Spanish students who attained national recognition for excellent performance on the 2020 National Spanish Examinations, conducted this past March. Students from Elk Grove High School earned a total of one gold, one silver and 9 bronze medals along with 30 honorable mentions.

"Attaining a medal or honorable mention for any student on the National Spanish Examinations is very prestigious," said Kevin Cessna-Buscemi, National Director of the Exams, "because the exams are the largest of their kind in the United States with over 140,000 students registered in 2020."

Meningitis Vaccine Requirements:



Just a reminder that all students 16 years of age and older are required to receive a meningitis vaccine prior to entering 12th grade. If students do not provide proof of having received a meningitis vaccine by the date indicated from the school district, the child can be excluded from school until the appropriate documentation is received by our school health office. Students who have a medical, or other reason, for not receiving the vaccine must provide documentation to the health office indicating the exception.

Ronald McDonald Medical Van:

Students who are on Medicaid insurance or have no insurance coverage are eligible to participate in the Ronald McDonald Medical Van Service.

This service is sponsored by Advocate Health Care and dates for these clinics are booked throughout the school year at Elk Grove H.S. They provide sports physicals, school physicals and immunizations. Please contact the school health office to advise if you would like to participate or if you would like to receive further information.



Flu/Cold Information:

Influenza (the flu) is a serious illness. Symptoms can include sore throat, headache, fever, cough, nasal congestion/sneezing, fatigue, muscle/body aches and weakness. Children may also feel nauseated, vomit or have diarrhea. Cold symptoms are very similar to flu symptoms, however the primary differences between a cold and the flu is that the flu comes on very suddenly and typically causes a fever to occur whereas with a cold your symptoms often



come on gradually and a fever is often not present. If you suspect that either you or a loved one has the flu, it is important to seek medical evaluation for proper diagnosis and treatment.

Transmission: The flu and cold are both caused by viruses and both are typically spread via droplet transmission. This means that when people that are infected with the flu or cold virus and they are coughing and sneezing, they release droplets into the air that can be inhaled by other people who can then become infected. When someone coughs or sneezes, the droplets that they expel into the air can travel up to 20 feet at speeds of 25-50 miles per hour. These droplets can also stay suspended in the air for hours.

You can also get the flu from contaminated surfaces (for example - doorknobs, faucets, telephones). When you touch a contaminated surface and then touch your face, this allows the virus to enter your nose or mouth and transmit itself. Keep in mind that viruses can live on surfaces for up to 24 hours.

Treatment for the flu includes increasing water intake, potential antiviral medication (if diagnosed within 48 hours of onset), and plenty of rest. Antibiotics are ineffective against the flu and are sometimes prescribed to prevent a secondary infection related to a cold virus. Before using over the counter cold or flu treatments, please consult with your medical provider.



If your child is under 18 years of age, it is very important that you check with your child's medical provider before administering aspirin or cold/flu products containing aspirin.

Other Information: According to the CDC, people who have the flu are typically contagious from 1 day prior to becoming symptomatic and up to 7 days after becoming symptomatic. Therefore, it is very important that you stay home from work or school for approximately 7 days after symptoms begin to ensure you are no longer contagious to others. Sometimes when you begin feeling better you feel well enough to return to normal activities (including work or school), however please keep in mind that the goal is prevent others from getting sick as well which is why the CDC recommends staying home for at least 7 days from onset of symptoms.

As flu season approaches, it is important for you to consult with your medical provider to determine if you can receive it or not. The vaccine is generally recommended for those age 6-months and up. According to the CDC, people at the highest risk for flu-related complications are those with underlying health conditions, those over 65 years of age, and children under 5 years of age (especially children under the age of 2). Women who are pregnant should consult with their medical provider before obtaining the flu vaccine.





Hand washing is an easy, and very important, measure that people are encouraged to implement to assist in preventing transmission of the flu or cold virus to themselves or others. Vigorous hand washing with warm water and soap for at least 15 seconds is best practice.

Chronic Health Conditions:

School achievement is dependent upon effectively meeting the health needs of each student. If your student has a chronic health condition such as asthma, severe allergies, diabetes or a seizure disorder, it is important for the school, medical provider and family to work together to provide the best educational experience possible.

In an effort to provide your student the opportunity for a successful school year, a number of printable healthcare plans are available on the District 214 Health Services webpage: <u>https://www.d214.org/departments/health-forms/</u>

The care plans are designed to help the school nurse collaborate with your student's medical provider and family to ensure that the child's healthcare needs are met at school. You can print the care plan from the link listed above or go to the District 214 website and go to the Health Services tab. We ask that you do this prior to the start of each school year, or as soon as possible after the school year begins. **A new care plan is required each school year.**

Student Medication Information:

If your student requires daily medication, an epinephrine injector or inhaler during the school year, these forms are also available on the District 214 website on the Health Services page: <u>https://www.d214.org/departments/health-forms/</u>.

Please complete the forms with your student's medical provider and return them to the health office at your child's school along with the medication. The medication must be in its original container or packaging - or alternatively it must be in an appropriately labeled container from a pharmacy.

The school nurse is available to meet with you and your child to discuss their care plan or any concerns you may have regarding your child's healthcare needs at school.

Students with Asthma:

Illinois State Law requires that all students diagnosed with Asthma have an Asthma Action Plan on file with their school. An Asthma Action Plan is a plan developed by you and your child's medical provider that provides the school nurse with an individualized plan of care for your student in the event that they experience asthma symptoms at school or at school-sponsored events (such as coughing, wheezing, shortness of breath, chest tightness or difficulty breathing). We encourage you to consult with your child's medical provider whether or not the child can self-carry their emergency asthma medication at school or if you prefer to keep it with the school nurse.

The Medication Permission/Medication Self-Carry Form must be completed and turned in along with the Asthma Action Plan. The links to all of the appropriate forms are listed below. We ask that you print out the forms you need, sign/date them, and have your student's medical provider complete the rest of the forms. **The completed forms should be returned to the School Nurse at your student's school.**

Students with Severe Allergies:

Additionally - It is very important that the school nurse be made aware if your child has a severe allergy to any food, insects, latex or other allergens. A Severe Allergy Action Plan should be completed by you and your student's medical provider and be turned in to the Health Office at your student's school as soon as possible.

On July 1, 2020 the Seizure Smart School Act was signed into law in Illinois. One aspect of this law requires that parents/guardians of children with epilepsy provide a **Seizure Action Plan** to the school nurse so that medical care specific to their child can be provided at school or at school-sponsored activities. INFORMATION REGARDING "EVERY STUDENT SUCCEEDS" AND ELK GROVE HIGH SCHOOL

The Elementary and Secondary Education Act (also known as the Every Student Succeeds Act or ESSA) is a federal law meant to ensure that all school children, whatever their economic background, can achieve high academic standards. Because of this law, Elk Grove High School receives funding from the federal government in the form of Title I and Title II-A grants. The Title I grant is awarded to the school based on the number of low-income students enrolled. This grant supports programs for children who are at risk of failing. The Title II-A grant helps pay for teacher training and professional development. Title grant funding covers part of the cost of programs at Elk Grove such as supplementary tutoring, field trips to college campuses, Collegepalooza, and parent outreach meetings.

ESSA also says that parents have a right to know about the professional qualifications of their children's classroom teachers. You can ask for information about teachers' licensing and academic degrees. You also have the right to know whether your child is being provided services by paraprofessionals and what their qualifications are. We are pleased to report all teachers in District 214 are highly qualified, as defined by the Illinois State Board of Education. Highly qualified teachers have a bachelor's degree or higher and a state teaching license. In addition, for each core subject area of teaching responsibility, all teachers have either passed a content-area test or completed a college degree in that subject. All paraprofessionals are endorsed by the state as paraprofessional educators, having completed at least 60 semester hours of college credit or the equivalent. If this situation ever changes, you will be notified promptly.

Elk Grove High School and District 214 encourage you to become involved in your child's education, as outlined in the accompanying School-Parent Compact. You are invited to attend the annual Title I meeting and parent-teacher conferences, and you are also encouraged to join groups such as the Parent Teacher Council and Padres Unidos. A schedule of parent activities is published in the quarterly newsletter and on the school website. It is district policy that parents, staff and students share the responsibility for improved academic achievement.

INFORMACIÓN SOBRE "CADA ESTUDIANTE TRIUNFA" Y ELK GROVE HIGH SCHOOL

La Ley de Educación Primaria y Secundaria (también conocida como Cada Estudiante Triunfa o ESSA, por sus siglas en inglés) es una legislación que intenta asegurar que todos los estudiantes, sin importar sus situaciones económicas, puedan alcanzar altos estándares académicos. Gracias a esta ley, Elk Grove High School recibe fondos del gobierno federal en la forma de subvenciones llamadas Título I y Título II-A. La subvención Título I se otorga a la escuela basándose en el número de estudiantes con bajos recursos. Esta subvención apoya programas para niños en riesgo de reprobar. La subvención Título II-A ayuda a pagar por el entrenamiento y desarrollo profesional de maestros. Estas subvenciones federales cubren parte del costo de los programas en Elk Grove, tales como la tutoría suplementaria, excursiones a recintos universitarios, el evento Collegepalooza, y reuniones de enlace familiar.

ESSA también dice que los padres tienen derecho a saber acerca de las cualificaciones profesionales de los maestros de sus hijos. Usted puede pedir información sobre las cualificaciones de los maestros de su hijo/a, incluso sus licencias y títulos universitarios. Usted también tiene el derecho de saber si su hijo/a está recibiendo servicios de un asistente y cuales son sus cualificaciones. Nos da gusto informarle que todos los maestros en el Distrito 214 están altamente cualificados, según la definición de la Junta Educativa del Estado de Illinois. Los maestros altamente cualificados tienen al menos una licenciatura (bachelor's degree) y una licencia estatal de enseñanza. Además, para cada asignatura principal que el maestro enseña, él/ella ha pasado un examen estatal o ha completado un título universitario en esa materia. Todos los asistentes del Distrito 214 son aprobados por el estado como educadores paraprofesionales, con al menos 60 horas de estudio universitario o el equivalente. Si esta situación cambia, usted será notificado lo más pronto posible.

Elk Grove High School y el Distrito 214 les recomiendan que se involucren en la educación de su hijo/a, así como se describe en el Pacto adjunto. Se le invita a asistir a la reunión anual de Título I y a las conferencias individuales con sus maestros, y también se le alienta a unirse a grupos como Padres Unidos y el Parent Teacher Council. Un calendario de actividades para padres se publica en el boletín y en el sitio Web de la escuela. Es la norma del distrito que los padres, el personal y los alumnos compartan la responsabilidad de mejorar los logros académicos.
