COVID-19 UPDATES

District 214 Update Regarding COVID-19

Please see information below regarding changes to grading policies and learning opportunities due to the COVID-19 pandemic. As of the start of the 2021-22 school year, all students will attend school in-person, with no option for remote learning. Please feel free to reach out with any questions or if you would like more up-to-date information.

Spring 2020 Changes

Due to COVID-19, District 214 adopted a policy to ensure that no student's grade becomes negatively impacted as a result of circumstances out of their control. All schools in District 214 offered opportunities for students to only enhance their academic grade as of March 16, 2020. Rather than F grades, students were given the opportunity to audit (AU) or take a grade of an incomplete (I) except in the case of Dual Credit courses.

2020-2021 School Year Changes

District 214 students worked remotely to start the school year with the plan to bring in pods of students gradually. While we mainly operated on a hybrid model, there were periods of full remote learning throughout the school year as positivity rates changed. As of April 5, 2021, all students were welcomed back. Families were able to submit a request for a medical or household exemption and all classes were taught in a way that students could join online or in person. In-person attendance varied due to quarantine policies and student choice.

Teachers were given the option to award grades of A, B, C, D, F or P, AU, NC for all classes, including those required for graduation. P, AU and NC grades are not factored into GPAs.

School and Community

Rolling Meadows High School (RMHS) is one of six four-year comprehensive public high schools in Township High School District 214. Located in the northwest suburbs, RMHS is 30 miles northwest of downtown Chicago, Illinois. The school community is primarily middle income and residential.

RMHS serves the southwestern portion of District 214, which includes Rolling Meadows and portions of Arlington Heights and Mt. Prospect. There are 122 licensed staff members.

Block Schedule: RMHS is on a block schedule and classes are 80 minutes in length. RMHS follows an 8 period block schedule each semester (4 periods per day, alternating days). Semester classes typically earn .5 credits.

General Education

Courses designed to prepare students for postsecondary education and careers.

Honors

RMHS offers 17 rigorous honors courses for students with an outstanding record of achievement in a subject. **College credit: Advanced Placement (AP) courses**

RMHS offers 29 AP courses.

College credit: Dual Credit courses

District 214 offers over 70 dual credit courses.

Dual credit course numbers begin with a 6 and are weighted as AP courses.

Graduation Requirements

21 units of credit, including:

- 4 English
- 3 Mathematics
- 2 Science
- 2 Social Science
- 1 World Language OR Career and Technical Education class
- .5 Health Education

- Minimum of 3.5 days of participation in Physical Education (except when in Health Education)
- Fine Arts (pass one approved course)
- Consumer Education (pass one approved course)
- Constitution exam
- State Exam (SAT for class of 2021)
- FAFSA completion (or waiver on file)

District 214 Grading Scale & Policies

- Grading Scale: A 90-100; B 80-89; C 70-79; D 60-69; F 0-59. Grades earned in physical education and driver education are not included in GPA.
- As of the 2017-2018 academic year, G.P.A. is reported on a 4.0 scale.
- District 214 has not reported class rank since the 2012-2013 school year. Class rank, top GPA and GPA deciles are not available.
- GPA is calculated by dividing the total number of grade points earned by the total number of credits attempted.
- If a course is repeated for a higher grade, both courses are listed on the transcript. The initial grade is replaced with "RE" and only the higher grade is factored into the GPA.
- PE, Driver's Ed, Pass/No Credit (P/NC) and Audit (AU/AT) are not included in the GPA.
- District 214 schools do not post ACT or SAT scores on transcripts.
- District 214 staff are legally permitted to respond only to the personal questions concerning information contained in a student's permanent record.
- All District 214 schools are fully recognized by the Illinois State Board of Education. All schools are also members of NACAC, IACAC and College Board.
