Academic Indicators

GPA 2.8 out of 4.0 and **one** or more of the following academic indicators:

□ Advanced Placement Exam (3+)

□ Advanced Placement Course (A, B or C)

Dual Credit College English and/or Math (A, B or C)

□ College Developmental/Remedial English and/or Math (A, B or C)

□ Algebra II (A, B or C)

□ International Baccalaureate Exam (4+)

Standardized Testing Benchmarks (minimum score)

SAT Exam: Math (530) Reading and Writing (480)
 ACT Exam: English (18) Reading (22) Science (23) Math (22)
 College Readiness Placement Assessment (determined by post-secondary institution)

- Additional ACT or SAT
- AP Exams
- SAT Subject Tests
 - Most students DO NOT have to take these
 - 85 selective schools require subject tests (look online)


