APPRENTICESHIP TIMELINE

Junior Year (Second Semester)

- Interview and hire pre-screened candidates
- Implement work-based learning timeline

Junior Year (Summer)

Students work at job site 25-28 hours/week and take courses at partnering institutions

Senior Year

Students work at job site 15-20 hours/week and take courses at partnering institutions
