

From the School Nurse.....Morgan Vogel

Dear Elk Grove High School Students and Families:



My name is Morgan Vogel and I am the Certified School Nurse for Elk Grove High School. I am very proud and excited to be part of, and serve, the EGHS community. If there is anything that I can do to assist you or your student, or if you have any questions, please do not hesitate to contact me at 847-718-4473. If you need to fax any forms or paperwork to me, please fax these items to the Health Office at 847-718-4562. I have listed some reminders below regarding important Health Services guidelines.

UPDATING PHONE NUMBERS:

Please remember to call the attendance office to report any phone number changes. It is very important that we have updated and accurate information in case of an emergency. Students that need to go home due to illness or injury will not be excused without permission from a parent/guardian or emergency contact.

ILL/INJURED STUDENTS:

<u>Important Reminder</u> - Keeping students who are ill in the health office for long periods of time poses a health risk to other students and staff members who may need to utilize the health office during the school day. For this reason, we kindly ask that you please have at least one person listed as an emergency contact who is available during the day to pick up your child within a reasonable amount of time should it become necessary. Additionally, keeping students in the health office for long periods of time who are injured may pose a health risk to the injured student as they may be exposed to illnesses from other students and staff members utilizing the health office. For this reason, we again ask that you please have at least one person listed as an emergency contact who is available during the day to pick up your child within a reasonable amount of time should it become necessary. We greatly appreciate your understanding and cooperation.

VISITS TO THE NURSE:

Any students coming to the nurse must have a pass from their current class. If it is a passing period, the student needs to get a pass from the class they will be starting. The only exceptions are when a situation is emergent (bleeding, feeling lightheaded, etc.) or during lunch. It is the nurse's discretion whether to allow a student to rest in the health office during a class period. Many things are considered (reason for request, grades, attendance, previous visits to the nurse, etc.). One of our goals of the health office is to treat the student comprehensively, but expediently, so that we reduce the time they are out of the classroom while facilitating their ability to function optimally and be ready to learn.

MEDICATION GUIDELINES:



The responsibility for administering student medication rests solely with the parents, or guardian, therefore a schedule should be arranged so that all medication is taken at home under parental supervision and not during school hours whenever possible. In exceptional cases, when medication must be taken during the school day, the regulations from the Illinois Department of Public Health, "Guidelines for Management of Medication in the Schools" will be implemented by the Certified School Nurse as follows:



Procedures:

- 1. The school nurse is to be informed of students who are receiving medication for long-term medical conditions.
- 2. Whenever possible, medication should be self-administered under the supervision of the school nurse or an administrator.
- 3. Medication is to be brought to the school in a container which has been appropriately labeled by a pharmacy or a medical provider.
- 4. When medication must be administered at school, the parent or guardian must provide to the school nurse a District 214 medication request form authorizing the administration of the prescribed medication. This form is available at the school health services office or for download on the district or individual school web site (www.d214.org or eghs.d214.org, click on Parents, Health Services and then Forms). Yearly renewal is required.
- 5. Tylenol or Acetaminophen can now be administered with parental permission using the online registration form.
- 6. The school nurse and/or the principal may, at their discretion, reject a request for administration of a medication. It is understood that the school district provides this service in the interest of the well-being of students and as an accommodation to parents.

Developed by: District 214 Advisory Committee as mandated by state law (P.A. 86-1441). The members of this committee are representatives of District 214 administrators, school nurses, teacher-trainers, community physicians, nurses and parents.

ASTHMA INHALER/EPI PEN POLICY: Asthma Inhaler/Epi-Pen Policy

In accordance with 105ILCS 5/22-30 and District 214 Medication Policy, students may carry and self-administer asthma medication or their prescribed Epi-Pen at school. An Asthma Inhaler/Epi-Pen Request form needs to be completed yearly and must be signed by the student's medical provider. This form can also be obtained in the school health office or on the school or district website. Each student should carry his/her inhaler/Epi-Pen in its original pharmacy labeled container with the student's name, the drug name and exact dosage as well as the indication or time in which the medication should be taken. As with any medication, neither inhalers nor Epi-Pens should be shared with other students.



Township High School District 214 Assessments 2021-2022

District 214 administers assessments to its students to provide them, their parents, and high school staff with performance information. The information is used for:

- Placement in appropriate courses
- Identifying the need for additional instruction
- Monitoring student growth
- Determining the extent to which students are meeting district and state standards
- Providing information to enrich the curriculum and instruction
- Providing information for making post-secondary educational and vocational decisions

District 214 is committed to:

- Providing frequent, purposeful, appropriate, and fair assessments accompanied by timely feedback
- Helping students and parents make good use of assessment data in the decision making processes
- Helping staff understand and effectively utilize assessment data

Township High School District 214 coordinates districtwide assessment programs for high school students.

- State of Illinois Assessment Program that complies with the requirements of the State Board of Education.
- College-Bound Assessments aid students in making decisions with regards to their college plans. These are assessments such as the National ACT and SAT where students register for the test online.

This pamphlet describes the assessments, Student Population, date and place for each assessment. Current fees shown for optional tests are subject to change.

Testing Accommodations

If your student requires accommodations for testing under an IEP or 504 plan and will register for one of the optional assessments, please contact the counselor or case manager in your school at the beginning of the school year to learn how to apply for accommodations for the specific tests.

State of Illinois Assessment Program

PSAT 8/9 and PSAT 10 are assessments in the College Board's SAT Suite of Assessments. The PSAT 8/9 and PSAT 10 are guidance resources that help students measure their current academic development, explore AP course options, and assess readiness for college and career options. The assessments include Reading, Writing and Language, and Math. The PSAT 8/9 and PSAT 10 will help prepare students for the SAT

assessment taken during their junior year and are state required assessments.



Dear Parent/Guardian,

Immunization Requirement for the 2021-2022 School Year:

For the 2021-2022 school year, <u>all students entering 12th grade shall show proof of having received two doses of MENINGOCOCCAL CONJUGATE VACCINE (Menactra, Menveo, MCV4) prior to starting school.</u> The first dose should have been administered on or after their 11th birthday and the second dose on or after their 16th birthday. An interval of at least eight weeks between the first and second dose is required. Only one dose of the vaccine is required if the first dose is administered when the child is 16 years of age or older. You do not have to wait until your child is going into 12th grade to get the 2nd dose of meningococcal conjugate vaccine - once your child turns 16 years-old they are eligible to receive it.

Your child may have already received both doses of the required Meningococcal Conjugate Vaccine, however we may not have received proof that they were given. Please check with your child's medical provider to determine if they received the two Meningococcal Conjugate Vaccines and, if they were given, please ask that they complete all information indicated below, including their signature and office stamp. If your child has not received both doses, you are required to get this vaccination for your child or your child will be subject to exclusion as described in the school code of Illinois.

Your child will not be able to receive their class schedule or attend school in August until all immunizations are up to date.

Please submit this completed form or an updated immunization record to the Health Office at Elk Grove High School as soon as possible.

INFORMATION REGARDING "EVERY STUDENT SUCCEEDS" AND ELK GROVE HIGH SCHOOL

The Elementary and Secondary Education Act (also known as the Every Student Succeeds Act or ESSA) is a federal law meant to ensure that all school children, whatever their economic background, can achieve high academic standards. Because of this law, Elk Grove High School receives funding from the federal government in the form of Title I and Title II-A grants. The Title I grant is awarded to the school based on the number of low-income students enrolled. This grant supports programs for children who are at risk of failing. The Title II-A grant helps pay for teacher training and professional development. Title grant funding covers part of the cost of programs at Elk Grove such as supplementary tutoring, field trips to college campuses, summer reading books, Collegepalooza, Estudiantes Unidos, and parent outreach.

ESSA also says that parents have a right to know about the professional qualifications of their children's classroom teachers. You can ask for information about teachers' licensing and academic degrees. You also have the right to know whether your child is being provided services by paraprofessionals and what their qualifications are. We are pleased to report all teachers in District 214 are highly qualified, as defined by the Illinois State Board of Education. Highly qualified teachers have a bachelor's degree or higher and a state teaching license. In addition, for each core subject area of teaching responsibility, all teachers have either passed a content-area test or completed a college degree in that subject. All paraprofessionals are endorsed by the state as paraprofessional educators, having completed at least 60 semester hours of college credit or the equivalent. If this situation ever changes, you will be notified promptly.

Elk Grove High School and District 214 encourage you to become involved in your child's education, as outlined in the accompanying School-Parent Compact. You are invited to attend the annual Title I meeting and parent-teacher conferences, and you are also encouraged to join groups such as the Parent Teacher Council and Padres Unidos. A schedule of parent activities is published in the quarterly newsletter and on the school website. It is district policy that parents, staff and students share the responsibility for improved academic achievement.







All proceeds directly benefit the District 214 Education Foundation, a 501(c)3 supporting innovation, student success and lifelong learning in all District 214 schools beyond the limitations of conventional public funding for education. Throughout the pandemic, the Foundation specifically provided basic needs funding to more than 400 families; handed out more than

Students Amass \$90,000 in Scholarship Awards

The District 214 Education Foundation in the spring distributed approximately \$90,000 in postsecondary scholarships to more than 70 graduating seniors from all District schools.

Among the highlights were the Redefining Ready! Awards, which



required applicants to create 30-second videos showing why they are college, career and life ready beyond a test score. Students did so in various ways, including through songs and video animation showing off their activities, achievements outside the classroom, early college credit opportunities and more.

Additionally, the groundbreaking Blueprint Bosch Vocational Scholarship was handed out for the third consecutive year. That scholarship covers, in full in most cases, the cost of a career training certificate in areas like welding, HVAC, plumbing, machining, automotive technology and carpentry. Scholarships are funded by individuals, businesses and organizations.

The Bosch Community Fund, through a unique partnership with the Foundation, provided an initial \$45,000 for the scholarship, or \$15,000 a year to help fund students' futures.

Scholarship applications for the upcoming school year will open in late December or early January, and students once again will be able to apply for most of them through a one-stop online portal that, based on their answers to screening questions, provides them a list of the scholarships for which they're qualified and allows them to apply directly online.



Foundation offers numerous opportunities for funding:

The District 214 Foundation provides a variety of opportunities for funding the future.
