M. Hineman reported that Prospect is one of only 12 schools in the state participating in the Illinois High School Dance Festival State Showcase scheduled for April 8 at Riverside Brookfield High School. One of the dances, choreographed by seniors Scarlet Bayer and Kate Wagner–was selected by a panel of judges for the state showcase.

M. Hineman reported that Prospect was named the IHSA student section showdown video state winner. Created by junior Alyssa Degan, Prospect's video celebrates the EveryKnight spirit of Prospect.

M. Hineman reported that he attended an Oceanography class at Prospect in the block schedule format.

M. Hineman reported that he participated in the 5K Fun Run at Prospect, part of the "Love Your Brain" Day festivities.

A. Kreutzer reported she attended the College Fair at FVEC, and thanked the organizers of the well-attended event.

A. Kreutzer reported Buffalo Grove sophomore Rohan Ganeshan is the first-ever Bison named to the Illinois Scholastic Bowl all-state team. Rohan has led the BGHS team during a stellar season, including its NAQT State Championship. The national high school tournament is in late May.

A. Kreutzer reported Elk Grove Associate Principal Arturo Senteno has been honored as 2022 Illinois Assistant Principal of the Year by Horace Mann and the Illinois Principals Association.

A. Rauch reported District 214 Wildstang – the undefeated First Robotics Team – placed first at the Central Illinois Regional Competition qualifying them to compete at the World Competition in Houston.
