We're off to a great start! We've had record numbers of students attend College Boot Camp and L.A.H.-lapalooza! and outstanding attendance at our College Essay-palooza! College Rep Kick-Off panel and college rep visits. Seniors are in full college application mode and are reminded to check the JHHS College Application Guide with any questions first. For this year only, the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) release is being delayed due to a revision to the application. Seniors can expect the application to open sometime in December or possibly early January. Stay tuned for more info on the FAFSA and the Alternative Application for Illinois Financial Aid (if ineligible for the FAFSA). Remember, this is a high school graduation requirement!

While most seniors will still be applying for a few more months, counselors will be getting the Class of 2025 started with building a college list full of schools that are the right fit for them. Juniors and their parents/guardians are HIGHLY ENCOURAGED to attend the "Finding the Right Fit" presentation on November 2nd at 7pm in the JHHS Theatre.

"BE PROACTIVE"

Greetings families!

As your household settles into a new school year routine, it's a good time to ask whether your school, work, and family-life balance supports each member's emotional health. How comfortable is your teen in his or her own skin? Do they feel recognized or heard? Are they on a path to becoming a productive adult that feels fulfilled by their pursuits?

This month we will be covering the first of three habits that make up The Private Victory, "Be Proactive". We will ask your student to evaluate their responses to the events that happen daily in their environment, to listen to their language... do they take responsibility for their actions or do they play the blame game? For example, a reactive thinker may say "I can't", where a proactive thinker will say "There has to be a way". Being proactive is about taking ownership of your life and intentionally walking toward a particular future or path. When you are proactive, you are the leader of your life because you take control of situations.

To generate some conversation with your teen, you may ask them "What are some different ways you can show you are in control of your life" (word that in your super cool parent way of course!). Some possible responses include being responsible, making good choices, thinking before you act, doing your best, writing down your goals and having a positive attitude.

Everytime your student uses these skills, he or she will be building positive self-regard and self-confidence. Exhibiting self control can be very empowering! When someone is rude to you, where do you get the power to resist being rude back? As Sean Covey says, "just push pause" and dig into your human toolbox.

The Human Tool Box

Self- Awareness: I can stand apart from myself and observe my thoughts and actions.

Conscience: I can listen to my inner voice to know right from wrong.

Imagination: I can envision new possibilities.

Willpower: I have the power to choose.

- 1. If you get in a fight with someone, be the first to make amends, no matter who was at fault.
- 2. The next time you receive a grade you feel is unfair, make an appointment with the teacher instead of complaining.


